

**A Report on the 7<sup>th</sup> all India conference of  
``All India Navodaya Vidyalaya Staff Association``  
On 07-05-2017 at Mavalankar Auditorium, New Delhi**

The 7<sup>th</sup> all India conference of All India Navodaya Vidyalaya Staff Association (AINVSA) was organised successfully on 07-05-2017 at the historic Mavalankar Auditorium, New Delhi. It was attended by over 512 delegates from all parts of the country.

The conference was inaugurated by Shri Arjum Ram Meghwal, Hon'ble Minister of State for Finance, Govt. of India at 10.30 a.m. by lighting the lamp. Earlier he had unfurled the tri-coloured national flag outside the auditorium. Addressing the delegates, the Hon'ble Minister urged the delegates to take pride in their noble calling – teaching. He wished the conference a grand success and promised them that he would look into the issues like 10% special allowance and MACPS benefits to the teaching staff positively. He sought an assurance from the staff to promote the Swachh Bharat Campaign launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modiji.

The inaugural session of the Conference began with the singing of Navodaya Song by a group of music teachers. Shri Tapan Sen, Hon'ble Member of Parliament and General Secretary, CITU and Shri C.N.Bharti, Geneneral Secretary, STFI, Shri Jagdish Rai, President, AINVSA and Shri L.B.Reddy, General Secretary, AINVSA, graced the programme.

At the outset of the programme Shri Uttam Soneparke, Deputy General Secretary offered condolences to the deceased staff from various vidyalayas in the last 3 years. The conference observed 2 minutes silence as a mark of respect to the departed teaching and non-teaching staff.

Later, Shri L.B.Reddy, General Secretary, AINVSA, welcomed the Guests of Honour and the delegates to the conference formally. He expressed his gratitude and praised the delegates who had taken much pain to reach Delhi. He also briefed about the proceedings of the one-day conference.

Shri Jagdish Rai, President, AINVSA also welcomed the delegates from the nooks and corners of India and emphasized on the importance of strengthening the association. In his brief speech he narrated how a small group of anti-employee staff had tried to sabotage the nation-wide strike in February 2013. He lamented how the long working hours are affecting the physical health of the staff. He went on to decry the corruption at vidyalaya level and urged the Association members to fight against it in unison.

Expressing his solidarity with the agitating teaching and non-teaching employees of the Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas across the country, Shri Tapan Sen, Hon'ble Member of Parliament (RS) & General Secretary, CITU highlighted how the Pension Scheme was universal and how it was the responsibility of the governments to ensure the financial security of the employees after their retirement. He shed light on the evils of privatisation and communalisation of education. He explained how the number of vacancies in the central government organisations were lying vacant for years. The government expenditure on education has also been decreasing year after year. Shri Tapan Sen also elaborated on how the reforms started by Dr Manmohan Singh when he was the Finance Minister of India are being continued even now by the present government. He exhorted the participants to join the larger struggle of the masses and trade unions for their basic rights in order to get more support and sympathy for their genuine demands. Before concluding his speech, the Hon'ble MP conveyed greetings from CITU to AINVSA for organising its 7<sup>th</sup> all India Conference in New Delhi.

During his address to the delegates Shri C.N.Bharti, Gen. Secretary, School Teachers Federation of India (STFI), explained the differences between the old and new pension schemes. He said that the governments are encouraging Public-Private-Partnership, which, according to him, is a dangerous system. He opined that education has become a lucrative field for private investment. The private institutions are collecting high fees from the public but paying very little to the employees, thus depriving them of their right for equal pay. He urged the participants to fight against contractual appointments. He added that teachers are the nation builders and the most trusted people of the nation. He advised the delegates not to be afraid of the threats from the management. He wanted the Association to establish a link with sister organisations and fight together for common goals.

With the proposal of vote of thanks from Shri Tafseer Anwer, Dep. Gen. Secretary (CEC), the inaugural session of the 7<sup>th</sup> all India Conference of the Association dispersed for lunch break.

After a brief lunch break the delegation session was begun by Shri L.B.Reddy, General Secretary with his request to the Presidium to address the delegates. Smt. K.Manjula, Treasurer (CEC) explained the efforts made by the AP and Telangana state units to sustain the association by funding the expenses for various delegations to Delhi. She felt that the Association can build more pressure on the management and the government of India when the members meet their respective MPs and enlighten them of the problems faced by the staff by briefing them and giving representations. She categorically told the delegates that the Association cannot be run without strengthening the financial resources. Shri S.S.Dora, Associate President (CEC) said that AINVSA is the only association among the autonomous organizations that is fighting for the resolution of the issues of the staff. He expressed his unhappiness at the management's failure to translate promises into action. In his brief address he touched upon the issues like 10% special allowance to the non-teaching staff, minimum wages to the daily wage staff, promotion of drivers, cadre restructuring, etc. Addressing the delegates, Shri Shaik Maroof, Vice-President (CEC) requested them to trust and support the leadership. He emphasised on the importance of setting up a full-fledged office of the Association in New Delhi. He urged the staff to fight against oppression and participate in large numbers when a call for an agitation is given by the Association.

Presenting his report, Shri L.B.Reddy, General Secretary, brought to the notice of all that the financial condition of the Association is very weak. As a result, it is unable to carry out many activities on a full scale. He also stressed on the importance of strengthening the association from the grass root level. He elaborated the efforts taken to strengthen the Association by conducting state meetings in the recent past. He requested the State Executive Members to visit the schools regularly and establish strong contacts with the vidyalaya units. He asked the delegates to update themselves with the associational activities by browsing the association website – ainvs.com regularly. He expressed his unhappiness at the poor turnout of delegates from the schools in the neighbourhood of Delhi. He shed light on the stringent policy of the government which is reflected in the delay in the implementation of the 7<sup>th</sup> CPC recommendations and the withdrawal of adhoc bonus recently. He remarked that the problems of the employees are not covered by the media as they were biased and corrupt. He requested the CEC to meet twice and the SEC to meet three times in a year. He said that SEC and CEC members should visit vidyalayas on holidays in order to strengthen the Association. He wished that the Women's Forum will work actively in the days to come. He sought help from the delegates to take the message of the Association to every member by translating the representations from English into Hindi and vice versa. The representations may also be translated into regional languages. He also appealed to the delegates to use the social media judiciously. Concluding his speech, Shri L.B.Reddy stressed on the importance of participating in the agitations in large numbers and joining hands with like-minded organisations to carry out the agitations successfully and compel the management and the government of India to fulfil our demands. The delegates listened to the Secretary's report with rapt attention and expressed their approving with thunderous applause.

Shri G.S.Basavaraju, Associate President, CEC, put before the conference 69 resolutions for approval. He read them out and requested the delegates to offer suggestions for amendments and additions or deletions. All the resolutions were unanimously approved by the conference.

The Conference took up the election of new CEC members. Shri C.N.Bharti, Gen. Sec., STFI was invited by Shri L.B.Reddy to act as the Election Officer. Accepting the invitation, Shri C.N.Bharti appealed to the delegates to choose efficient people as the shouldering of associational responsibilities demands efficiency as well as commitment. He declared the old CEC stood dissolved and requested Shri L.B.Reddy to present a list of new CEC members if he has any. Shri L.B.Reddy read out a list of new office bearers. The new officer bearers were proposed by Shri Jagdish Rai and seconded by Shri L.B.Reddy. The delegates unanimously approved the list presented by Shri L.B.Reddy. The new list of CEC office bearers is now headed by Smt. K.Manjula as President and Shri Tafseer Anwer as General Secretary. The list of new office bearers is added separately with this report. The Conference also elected some office bearers to the Women's Forum. The list of office bearers of the Women's Forum was also approved unanimously by the Conference. Shri C.N.Bharti, Gen. Secretary, STFI conducted oath for the new office bearers. The delegates also unanimously authorised to make additions and deletions in the present CEC list in the next CEC meeting.

K.Manjula, the newly elected President thanked the delegates for unanimously accepting the new panel of office bearers and assured that the new CEC will leave no stone unturned to fight for the long pending problems of the staff. She sought the whole-hearted support of the Conference.
